Dear Fellow Followers of the Way,

I love rain. I particularly love to splash in puddles. One evening while in seminary, one of my friends and I went out and played in the puddles after we were finished with class for the day. Fellow students and some professors looked at us rather quizzically as we were absorbed in splashing each other. At one point in our puddle-stomping fun my friend yelled, "Remember your baptism!" This yell was followed by a wave of water that was kicked my way.

A few weeks ago we joined together for the Easter Vigil, we celebrated a remembrance of baptism during the service. It is a time to remember that we have gone under the waters and have been buried with Christ and to remember that we have been raised to new life in Christ as well. As we celebrate and remember our own baptism let us also remember the promises that we have made as others have been baptized as well.

All of the children and youth who have been baptized have been given the promise that people would nurture them, teach them, and be the body of Christ to them. This Sunday, the youth will lead us in worship and we

can celebrate with them the nurture and care they have received to this point in their journey of faith. In the coming weeks the Session will hear statements of faith from the confirmands, and we will welcome them as new members of Westminster.

Many of you have contributed to the spiritual lives of these young people. Know that as a family of faith, what we say and do impacts our children. I encourage everyone to find ways to nurture the children and youth of the church. Teach Sunday school, help with youth group, sing with the children, offer your gifts and talents in other ways with them, and even something as simple as greeting them and welcoming them when you see them. One of the great joys of being a part of a family of faith is to witness milestones and celebrate them together. How can you follow through on promises you have made at the baptism of our children and youth in the coming days and weeks as we celebrate with them?

Fellowship Hall News and Dedication Event

We had a wonderful celebration in our new Fellowship Hall on Easter Sunday. In spite of a heavy downpour of rain, we managed to stay quite dry in our new home! Over 400 Westminster members and friends enjoyed

breakfast prepared by the Manchaca Fire Department that morning. The tables were beautifully adorned with flowers, baskets of fresh grass and brightly colored eggs. Thanks to Catherine Colvin, Angela Oliver and members of the Fellowship Committee for all of their efforts to help us open the new space in such grand style.

During the next few weeks, crews will be completing punch list items (touch up painting, spot cleaning, mechanical adjustments, etc.) as they put the finishing touches on our new building. We will wait until these items are complete before moving into the building and receiving our certificate of occupancy.

Fellowship Hall will be officially dedicated on Pentecost Sunday evening, May 31. All members and friends are invited to join us for this momentous occasion in the life and history of Westminster.

Youth Sunday – April 26

The youth of Westminster Presbyterian Church will be leading worship on April 26th. The text for the morning is Acts 3: 1-19, as Peter and John heal the lame man at the temple gate. Come glorify God and be joined with the Body of Christ in this place. Are you ready for a miracle?

WPC Financial Update

The March financial statements presented include the income statement for all the funds of the church and a budget comparison for the General Fund. The full financial statements are available in the church office on a monthly basis. We encourage anyone who is interested to pick up a copy or ask Jimmie to email you one.

The funds of the Church are broken out into four categories. The General Fund is used to provide the ongoing general operations of the Church such as missions, Christian education, personnel, and property maintenance. It is funded by an annual budget that is made up of pledges, contributions, and interest earnings. The Restricted Funds are used for donations, which can only be used for a specific purpose as designated by the donor. This category includes such funds and the Mission Fund, the Property Fund, memorials, and gifts directed toward a specific purpose. The third category is the Capital Campaign Fund. This fund is for receipt of gifts and their payment toward the construction of the fellowship hall and the benevolence portion for new church development. The last category is Endowments. In these funds, the original donation can never be spent, but instead is permanently invested and a portion of the income may be spent. This includes the General Endowment, the David Rainey Adult Christian Education Fund, the Mission Endowment, and a Choir Endowment.

Due to the generosity and commitment of the members of the church, we are currently ahead of budget on pledges. Additionally several members who had not completed their 2008 pledge have now done so and have helped begin to replenish our reserves. Expenses remain under budget. In the Capital Campaign, we continue to receive donations towards the Fellowship Hall. We have collected 78% of pledges in the Stepping Forward Campaign and 95% of pledges in the Building on Christ's Foundation campaign. Our construction loan totaled \$833,000 at the end of March.

The Finance and Administration Committee and the Session are committed to keeping our expenses within our means and working towards the financial challenges we will continue to face in the future.

Plant List for Westminster’s New Landscaping

Many of you have commented on how much you like the new Fellowship Hall and Columbarium landscaping and have asked for a complete list of plants. Designed by Hazel Herring’s daughter, Judith Herring Winter, the landscaping for the Columbarium features butterfly iris, Jerusalem sage, Mexican bush sage, copper canyon daisy, bush daisy, rosemary, purple trailing lantana, Indigo Spires salvia, dusty miller, gay feather, Mexican mint marigold, Mexican oregano, lavender cotton, yarrow, blue gray sedge, and Mexican feather grass. Carolyn Long selected and planned the layout of the plants for the Fellowship Hall and butterfly garden featuring Texas mountain laurel, Turk’s cap, dwarf yaupon, dwarf wax myrtle, southern wax myrtle, copper canyon daisy, Texas cenizo, sabal minor (palmetto), red yucca, agave, inland sea oats, bamboo muhly, cross vine, Virginia creeper, rosemary prostrate, coralberry, salvia greggii red, zexmenia, nolina texana, Mexican feather grass, American beautyberry, yarrow, native white plumbago, Katie dwarf ruellia, wafer ash, wooly stemodia, Texas sedge, fig ivy, Greggs mistflower, purple coneflower, black-eyed susan, and coreopsis. The new plants have already attracted a greater variety of birds and butterflies to the church campus. More information on the native plants is found at <http://www.wildflower.org/>.
