## Weekly Word

Dear saints,

The months of summer offer most of us a season of relaxation, slower time, less scheduled activities, and vacations. However, these days also find many at Westminster rolling up their sleeves and going to work – serving others and responding to the needs of God's people in the world. Many of you do this all year long, as we are called to do, but somehow, summertime offers us some particularly unique opportunities to engage in mission in our community and in the world.

A number of Westminster youth will travel on two different mission trips this summer. Our high school youth just returned from serving for a week at the **Stewpot** ([www.thestewpot.org](http://www.thestewpot.org)), serving meals to homeless people, working with children as part of a day camp, and learning about the issues of homelessness. The middle school youth will spend one week at **Heifer Ranch** in Arkansas participating in service-learning program of Heifer International ([www.heifer.org](http://www.heifer.org)). They will learn about issues of global poverty and hunger, while serving and working at the ranch – milking goats, working in the community garden, and spending time in Heifer’s experiential Global Village.

In early August, many Westminster members will be participating in the **Back to School Event at Manos de Cristo** – right here in Austin ([www.manosdecristo.org](http://www.manosdecristo.org)). A program known to many in the city, Back to School provides the full range of school supplies, along with some new clothes, for close to 2,000 youngsters who would not otherwise have those things at the start of the school year. **Our challenge from Manos this year is to provide one item that is on every kid’s school list – pink bar erasers – to help out with the school supply collection. We need 2,000 of them!** So...as you’re out shopping, grab as many pink erasers as you can, and bring them to church. You may put them in the pink tub by the Mission Bulletin Board.

And last but not least, in just eight weeks, we will continue our involvement with the **Interfaith Hospitality Network** ([www.foundationhomeless.org](http://www.foundationhomeless.org)) by hosting our first group of families that need shelter, housing, and food. The Fellowship Hall and several classrooms will be used to provide a safe and welcoming space for 3-4 families for a week. There are a number of ways for you to be involved: serving as an overnight host, bringing meals, providing supplies, and much more. Check the Mission Bulletin board for more information. There will be an informational meeting and training event on **Thursday evening, July 16 at 6 p.m. in the Fellowship Hall.** Join us!

Of course, there are many more ways to serve this summer; these are just a few. But as you are relaxing and enjoying recreation this summer, remember that God gives us rest – not to recover from whatever we’ve just done – but to prepare us for what will come next. I look forward to seeing you in the coming weeks, and to serving with you as we respond to the needs of God’s people in the world.

# Mission

## Religious Coalition to Assist the Homeless

The City of Austin allows Austin congregations that own their property and pay city utilities to divert one portion of their monthly utility bill – the Comprehensive Drainage Fee – to the Religious Coalition to Assist the Homeless (RCAH). The Austin City Council mandated the establishment of a coalition of religious organizations to administer these funds. The Religious Coalition to Assist the Homeless is overseen by individuals representing the participant congregations. Westminster contributed over **\$4000** (what would have been \$ paid for our Comprehensive Drainage Fee) last year to this fund. If you would like more information on the Coalition please go to [www.rcah.austin.org](http://www.rcah.austin.org). The RCAH contributes about a half a million dollars annually to agencies helping the homeless here in Austin.
