Dear WPC saints,

As you may have read, the Sunday morning Adult Forum Class (Fellowship Hall, 9:40 -10:40) is enjoying a four-week series of speakers entitled *Witnesses of Faith in the Community*. Each week, we hear from one or more "notable" Austinites, people of faith who are making a difference in our city. Last week, we heard from Alan Graham of Mobile Loaves and Fishes; this week will feature Ed Clements of KLB Radio and Randy and Jenna McEachern, local Longhorn fans; on October 11 we welcome Tom Spencer from the Austin Area Interreligious Ministries (you may recognize his name from his previous work with KLRU). However, the highlight of the four weeks will be here on **October 4. Gilbert Tuhabonye of the Gazelle Foundation will be with us - and you won't want to miss hearing what he has to say!**

Gilbert Tuhabonye was born on November 22, 1974, in the southern county of Songa in Burundi, a small mountainous country in east central Africa. He is the third of four children. His parents were part of the Tutsi tribe and were farmers by profession. They kept milk cows and raised potatoes, peas, corn and beans.

His love of running was forged early. Gilbert loved to run everywhere. He ran to the valley's edge to get water for his family. He ran to school, five miles away, and he loved to race his friends. His favorite thing to do was to chase his family's cows. He was baptized as a Catholic in the sixth grade and moved 150 miles away the next year to board at a Protestant school in Kibimba.

While attending the Kibimba school, Gilbert began running competitively. Running barefoot, he won an 8K race while only a freshman. As a sophomore, he met a man who taught him how to change his running technique by getting his knees up and holding his arms correctly. The coach encouraged him to work hard and try for the Olympics. Gilbert became national champion in the 400 and 800 meters as an 11th grader. As a senior, Gilbert was already an extraordinary runner whose goal was to get a scholarship to an American school, get an education and return home to Burundi.

Fate had another plan for Gilbert.

On October 21, 1993, the centuries-old war between the Tutsi and Hutu tribes erupted in horrific reality one afternoon as Gilbert and his classmates were in school. The Hutu classmates at the Kibimba school, their parents, some teachers and other Hutu tribesmen, forced more than a hundred Tutsi children and teachers into a room where they beat and burned them to death. After nine hours of being buried by the corpses of his beloved friends, and himself on fire, Gilbert used the charred bone of one of his classmates to break through a window. He jumped free of the burning building and ran into the night, on charred feet, the sole survivor of one of the most horrible massacres in the long Tutsi-Hutu war. He ran from that horror into a new life.

Now, 15 years later and more than 8,000 miles from Burundi, Gilbert Tuhabonye is a celebrity in the world of running. He went on to graduate college at Abilene Christian University where, despite being covered with scar tissue from his extensive burns, he was a national champion runner.

He is now, by all accounts, the most popular running coach in Austin, Texas where he lives with his wife, Triphine, and two daughters, Emma and Grace. Gilbert still competes, owns and operates a training program called Gilbert's Gazelles and is founder of the Gazelle Foundation.

His autobiography, *This Voice in My Heart*, is a must read!

So, bring some friends, and plan to be here on October 4! See you Sunday...

Presbyterian World Mission Challenge '09 – October 11 @ 7 p.m. – Westminster Fellowship Hall

What do you know about Colombia? Did you know there is a Presbyterian Church there? Did you know that many people from the Presbyterian Church (USA) have lived there as “accompaniers”?

On **Sunday evening, October 11 at 7 p.m.**, The Rev. Diego Higueta-Arango and Ms. Sara Henken will speak about the work of the Presbyterian Church in the area of peace and justice as it relates to the current violence in Colombia. They will speak about the church’s accompaniment program and how it represents a new way of being involved in mission. Higueta-Arango and Henken will address the violence that continues to plague Colombia. They will identify ways in which U.S. citizens can become advocates for the people of Colombia. **Their visit to WPC is part of the denomination-wide World Mission Challenge aimed at connecting missionaries and congregations across the life and ministry of the church. All Austin-area Presbyterian Churches are invited to attend!**

Diego Higueta is the Executive Secretary of the Presbyterian Church of Colombia. His current ministry focuses on the region of Urabá working with people in this rural area to bring peace and justice back to their community. He has also served the denomination as Moderator.

Sarah Henken is the coordinator of the Colombia Accompaniment Program, a partnership between Presbyterians in Colombia and in the United States in which U.S. Presbyterians stand with Christians in Colombia as they work nonviolently for peace. Her experience with Colombia began with her first trip as an accompanier in May of 2006. She has made five visits since then, including as a translator/interpreter for the Chicago Presbytery delegation to the Presbyterian Church of Colombia’s 150th anniversary celebration in August 2006. Originally from Los Angeles, Sarah lived in Uruguay and Argentina as a PC(USA) mission volunteer prior to her involvement with the Colombia Accompaniment Program.

International Peacemakers are leaders who are engaged in peacemaking in their own areas of the world. They are invited by the Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.) to visit with Presbyterians in the United States to help us understand the peace and justice concerns of others around the world. This sharing can also translate into a better understanding of the peace and justice issues in our own communities. Arranged through the Presbyterian Peacemaking Program of the Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.) in Louisville, Kentucky, the International Peacemakers Program has been in existence since 1988 and is supported by gifts to the Presbyterian Peacemaking Offering.
